The **2024 Nation's Report Card (NAEP)** will provide the nation, states, and large urban school districts with critical information about how our education systems are helping students make necessary gains in math and reading in grades 4 and 8 following steep score drops in 2022.

Policymakers and educators must use the information about how students are making up lost ground to accelerate efforts to help all students meet the standards and expectations necessary to succeed in school and beyond.

The **2024 Nation's Report Card** will be released in early 2025, instead of fall 2024, to allow time for the National Center for Education Statistics (NCES) to study if there are any impacts from changing assessment devices. Grade 12 national results will be released in spring/summer 2025 and the High School Transcript Study, linked to math, will also be released in 2025.

The 2022 Nation's Report Card <u>showed steep score declines nationwide</u> in math and reading for students in grades 4 and 8. These cohorts of students who were:

- 4th graders in 2022 are in **7th grade** in the 2024-25 school year.
- 8th graders in 2022 are in 11th grade in the 2024-25 school year.
